Frequently asked questions about fee remission process

1. Who are eligible to get fee remission?

Ans: As per the Government rules the UNRESERVED/OBC students are eligible to get the benefits of fee remission if the annual income of the family is as mentioned below.

- Most economically backward (MEB) students (whose family annual income below 1 Lakh (maximum allowable Rs.99,999/-).
- Other economically backward (OEB) students (whose family annual income between 1 lakh to 5 Lakhs (Maximum allowable Rs.4,99,999/-).

2. Are the students belonging to the SC/ST/PwD category eligible for fee remission?

Ans: The tuition fee is waived for the students belonging to the SC, ST and PwD categories. So, they are not entitled for fee remission again.

3. How much amount will be remitted to the MEB and OEB students?

Ans: Full tuition fee will be remitted to the MEB students and 2/3rd of the tuition fee will be remitted to the OEB students.

4. What is the procedure to apply for fee remission?

Ans: Scholarships section shall notify to submit application to claim fee remission for the odd semester in the 2nd or 3rd week of the odd sem. Candidates are required to apply for the same on or before the deadline along-with the required documents. The applications received after the due date will not be considered.

5. What are the documents required to be submitted along-with application?

Ans: Family income certificate in the name of father or, mother (in absence of father) or guardian (in absence of parents) issued by the competent authority (as prescribed by the respective the state Governments) on or after 1st April for that financial year.

6. The family income certificate was issued two years ago with validity 5 years. Will it be accepted?

Ans: As per the Government of India norms, any income certificate is valid only for one year. Hence, even though the local bodies issue the income certificate more than one year the certificate shall be

<u>treated as valid</u> only for the current year of the date of issue of such certificate. For the subsequent academic years, the candidate should submit the income certificate afresh.

7. Will the income certificate issued in the student's name be accepted?

Ans: The income certificate **shall not be in the name of respective student**, as the spirit of the income certificate is corresponding to the family income, but not the individual student as per fee remission norms.

- 8. Will the income certificate be accepted if the "Family income" phrase is not mentioned?

 Ans: In case, the certificate is issued without specifying the term "Family income", the candidate should submit the income certificate of his/her parents individually or combinedly. In such cases, the gross income should not cross the threshold limit to 1 lakh/5 lakhs.
- 9. If the annual family income is below 1 Lakh or 5 Lakhs, is it required to pay full tuition fees during the registration?

Ans: All the B.Tech. students (UR/OBC) are required to pay full tuition fee during the odd semester registration. The eligible candidates are required to pay tuition fees as per their category (OEB/MEB) during the even semester registration.

10. How much time will be given to submit application after publication of the notice?

Ans: Usually, one month time will be given to submit application and required documents to the concerned department.

11. When the list of eligible candidates will be published?

Ans: The list of eligible candidates for fee remission will be published approximately within two months after the deadline of submitting application.

12. From whom should a candidate collect the family income certificate?

Ans: The competent authority to issue such certificates as per the delegation of powers granted by the respective state/local government, else such certificates shall be treated as invalid.
