3. Inaugural Session

The event began with a formal welcome address by the **Associate Dean of Student Welfare**, Dr. Rajeswara Reddy Erva. He spoke about the institute's continued efforts to foster a safe and healthy academic atmosphere, strictly prohibiting any form of ragging or harassment.

Following the welcome, **DSP Dharmavarapu Viswanath** delivered a powerful keynote speech focusing on:

- The **serious psychological trauma** victims of ragging endure.
- The **stringent legal measures** against ragging as per UGC and Indian Penal Code provisions.

- Encouraging students to be **upstanders**, not bystanders, and report any such behavior without hesitation.
- Promoting **empathy, respect, and responsibility** among senior students towards their juniors.



4. Awareness Campaigns and Activities

As part of the event:

- **Anti-Ragging Awareness Posters** were unveiled.
 - An interactive session was conducted with the police, where students raised concerns and received clear guidance on safety protocols.
 - The **Anti-Ragging Helpline numbers** and contact information of committee members were distributed.
 - Several students shared **positive messages and experiences** promoting a ragging-free culture.

5. Oath-Taking Ceremony

A **collective anti-ragging pledge** was taken by all students, led by the faculty and police officials. Students promised:

- To never indulge in or support any form of ragging.
- To help juniors feel welcome and safe.
- To report incidents of ragging promptly and responsibly.

6. Observations from Speakers

- Registrar I/c of NIT Andhra Pradesh emphasized the need for mental health awareness and support for freshers transitioning into a new academic phase.
- Members of Student Welfare division elaborated on how ragging stunts creativity, confidence, and academic focus, urging students to foster positive interactions instead.

- Authorities also detailed the **mechanisms in place** for lodging complaints, handling investigations, and ensuring anonymity and safety for victims.

- The event saw enthusiastic participation from **students, faculty, and non-teaching staff**.
- The program was widely appreciated for its **transparency, clarity of message, and positive reinforcement** of student-friendly values.
- Local media and press covered the event extensively, highlighting NIT Andhra Pradesh's proactive stance on student safety.
